

Art Supplies List:

Use any supplies you already have and if you'd like to, go to dickblick.com to see products and prices to help you with your shopping. Any brand will be acceptable. Usually, as with most things: the more expensive the product- the better the quality and the results you will have. But because this is a broad overview of different mediums, you might wait to see if you want to continue with a certain type before you invest a lot of money. Most of these supplies can be used in other areas of your schooling.

Brushes-flat bristle #12, round synthetic #0, flat synthetic #2,#4, #12, bright synthetic #2,#4, fan bristle 1"

Art 1 & Art 2 only:

Heavy body acrylic colors-medium size 2oz. **tubes**, not jars.

(alizarin crimson, cadmium red, cadmium yellow light, yellow oxide, ultramarine blue, cobalt blue, titanium white (2 tubes or 1 large), ivory black, chromium green oxide)

Medium-priced soft pastels- set of 12 or 24

Inexpensive oil pastels-set of 8 or 12 (Cray-Pas Jr.) or

Painting/palette knife (2.5" pie-shaped wedge)
